

PETITIONER JUAN PINOY is a regional sectoral organization that exists and operates in the National Capital Region or "NCR", which is composed of sixteen (16) cities(1) and one (1) municipality.(2) 2. A filing fee of Ten Thousand Peoso (P 10,000,00), and a legal research fee of One Hundred Pesos (P 100.00) shall be charged for each petition." 5. That in Atong Paglaum vs. Comelec (G.R. No. 203766, April 2, 2013), the Supreme Court clarified the above rules and adopted the following "new" party-list registration parameters: "... [The COMELEC shall adhere to the following parameters: 1. Three different groups may participate in the party-list system: (1) national parties or organizations, (2) regional parties or organizations, and (3) sectoral parties or organizations. 2. National parties or organizations and regional parties or organizations and parties or organizations and underrepresented" sector. 3. Political parties con participate in party-list elections provided they register under the party-list system and do not field candidates in legislative district elections. A political party, whether major or not, that fields candidates in legislative district elections only through its sectoral wing that can separately register under the party-list system. The sectoral wing is by itself an independent sectoral party, and is linked to a political party through a coalition. 4. Sectoral parties or organizations may either be "marginalized and underrepresented" include labor, peasant, fisherfolk, urban poor, indigenous cultural communities, handicapped, veterans, and overseas workers. The sectors that lack "well-defined political constituencies" include political constituencies include political constituencies include political constituencies include constituencies" include professionals, the elderly, women, and the youth sectors that lack "well-defined political constituencies" include youth sectors that lack "well-defined political constituencies" include professionals, the elderly, women, and the youth. 5. A majority of the members of sectoral parties or organizations that represent the "marginalized and underrepresented" must belong to the "marginalized and underrepresented" sector they represent. Similarly, a majority of the members of sectoral parties or organizations that lack "well-defined political constituencies" must belong to the sector lack "well-defined political constituencies" must belong to the sector they represent. The nominees of sectoral parties or organizations that represent the "marginalized and underrepresented," or that represent those who lack "well-defined political constituencies," either must belong to their respective sectors, or must have a track record of advocacy for their respective sectors. The nominees of national and regional parties or organizations must be bona-fide members of such parties or organizations. 6. National, regional, and sectoral parties or organizations shall not be disqualified if some of their nominees are disqualified, provided that they have at least one nominee who remains qualified. 6. Thus, following Republic Act No. 7941, Comelec Resolution No. 9366 and the Atong Paglaum parameters, PETITIONER is seeking to REGISTER as a REGIONAL SECTORAL ORGANIZATION and praving that it be given all the rights and privileges appurtenant is seeking to REGISTER as a REGIONAL SECTORAL ORGANIZATION and praying that it be given all the rights and privileges appurtenant thereto. III.BRIEF BACKGROUND OF THE ORGANIZATION 7.

PETITIONER JUAN PINAGKAISANG ORDINARYONG MAMAMAYAN PARA YUMABONG ("JUAN PINOY") is composed of both members and advocates of promoting the rights and interests of the urban poor sector. The Party was organized to serve as a voice to empower the urban poor sector and to push for reforms and policies that aim to provide better opportunities for those who are in the urban poor sector. 8. The Party believes that true economic progress cannot be achieved if the urban poor, the very sector which lives within the limits of business and government centers of the economy, are left unattended, neglected, or even abused. 9. Section 3 of Republic Act No. 8425(3) (RA 8425) defines the following terms, to wit: (0) "Poor" Refers to individuals and families whose income fall below the poverty threshold as defined by the National Economic and Development Authority and/ or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing and other approach is the second of the content of the conte Authority and/ or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing and other essential amenities of life; (q)"Absolute poverty" — Refers to the condition of the household below the food threshold level; (r) "Relative poverty" — Refers to the gap between the rich and the poor; (u) "Urban poor" - Refers to individuals or families residing in urban centers and urbanizing areas whose income or combined household income falls below the poverty threshold as defined by the National Economic and Development Authority and/ or cannot afford in a sustained manner to provide their minimum basic needs of food, health, education, housing and other essential amenities of life; 10.According to the Philippine Statistics Authority(4) (PSA), in the first semester of 2018, a family of five needed no less than P7,337.00, on the average, to meet the family's basic food needs for a month. This amount is the "food threshold." On the otherhand, no less than P10,481.00, on the average, was needed to meet both basic food and non-food needs of a family of five in a month. This amount is the "poverty threshold." The 3,367 members of PETITIONER are spread in thirteen (13) out of the sixteen (16) Local Government Units (LGUs) comprising the National Capital Region, specifically, in the cities of manila, Caloocan, Las Piñas, Makati, Malabon, Maríkina, Navotas, Parañaque, Pasig, Quezon City, San Juan, Taguig and Valenzuela. This satisfies the minimum requirement of the COMELEC Rules that for an organization to register as a regional party-list, it must have members

PETITIONER, however, also opened its membership to those who are not urban poor, but consider themselves as advocates of the rights and interests of the urban poor. 31. The 834 members or 24.76% of the total membership who declared in their membership forms to be EMPLOYED ("may trabaho") were further classified depending on the amount of their monthly income. Out of the 834 members who are employed, 495members or 59.35% thereof have declared that they are earning below the amount corresponding to the food threshold (i.e. P7,337),while 193 members or 23.14% thereof have declared to be earning above the food threshold (i.e., 337) but still below the poverty threshold (i.e., P10,482). 34. The remaining 146 members or 17.5% of poverty threshold: Inesse are 10.9% higher than the rood and all proverty threshold (i.e., as are 10.9%) higher than the rood and an emethoded threshold is the minimum income required to meet the basic food needs, saltsfying the nutritional requirements set by the Food and Nutrition Research institute (FNR) to ensure that one remains economically and socially productive.
